E-Bike Definitions

From State Statute:

- Class I e-bike provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling and ceases to assist the rider when the bicycle reaches a speed of twenty miles per hour.
 - ✓ Max 20 mph no throttle
- Class II e-bike provides assistance regardless of whether the rider is pedaling but ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches a speed of twenty miles per hour.
 - ✓ Max 20 mph includes throttle
- Class III e-bike provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling and ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches a speed of twenty-eight miles per hour.
 - ✓ Max 28 mph no throttle

Survey Method

- Available online only, with option to send direct email to PRCS
- Two alternatives were provided for comment, a map was included
- Marketing methods
 - Social media posts (including a multi-day ad targeted to "outdoor recreation" profiles)
 - Toolkit for influencer groups to share with members
 - Traditional media interviews, articles, announcements at kickoff
 - Yard signs with QR codes at 35 locations
 - Survey card/flyer drop offs at more than 50 locations (combined, in all Council districts), including, libraries, businesses, Community Centers
 - Survey card/flyer distribution at trailhead parking lots, PRCS events, club events, other public occasions between June 17 and August 1



Overall Data

- 3,804 responses received between June 14 and August 4
- 3,535 responses included valid zip codes from residents within El Paso County, exceeding representative sample size of 2,393 responses
- Less than 2% margin of error with 95% confidence level
- 43 emails received during same period




Alternative 1: Class I e-bikes (maximum speed 20 mph and no throttle) allowed on all trails (including open space trails) and Class I and II e-bikes allowed on urban/regional trails within the PRCS system.





Overall support for Alternative 1 is 60%.

Alternative 2: Class I e-bikes (maximum speed 20 mph, no throttle) and Class II e-bikes(maximum speed 20 mph includes throttle) allowed only on urban/regional trail system within PRCS system.





Overall support for Alternative 2 is 35%.

Reasons for Support


- Inclusion of varying ability levels
- Accessibility for aging/disabled
- Already on trails
- Better for environment
- Less road congestion

Reasons for Opposition

- Speed/safety issues
- User conflicts/etiquette
- Trail and experience degradation
- Lack of enforcement
- Don't like them

** Reasons for support and opposition were consistent for both alternatives and generally comparable to e-bike studies and surveys elsewhere in Colorado and across the country.**







E-Bike Survey, June to Aug. 2024, City of Colorado Springs






Response to Alternative 1 by Age
