

## Frequently Asked Questions about Fiber Optic Installations on or near Your Property

**Background**: Fiber network installations by private companies are on the rise in The City of Colorado Springs (City). The purpose of this informational sheet is to provide additional information regarding the requirements for these companies, the basis of their authority, and how residents can direct concerns or problems.

Question: Are these companies allowed to do these installations? What are the requirements?

**Answer**: Yes, private companies are allowed to install fiber within the public right-of-way (ROW). The City requires these companies to possess an excavation license and obtain permits for any work performed within the ROW. The City's ROW Team approves and oversees these permits and then inspects any restoration within the ROW.

## Question: What gives these companies the authority to perform this work?

**Answer:** Colorado state laws and the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) allow private companies to install fiber so long as they meet municipal guidelines (in our case, pulling the proper permits). For more information, please reference the following State laws:

Question: One of these companies damaged my private property. What can I do?

**A:** You will need to contact the company. They City has a list of contacts it may provide, depending on who did the work. Question: Where are my property lines? Where are my easements?

Question: Do these companies have the right to go in my back yard?

**Answer:** Many properties have a backyard public utility easement. Most of the fiber installation currently ongoing in the city is for private companies.
